Thank you to everyone who participated in Bring One for the Chipper on January 5th! We had a record turnout of volunteers and trees recycled this year. Remember to recycle your tree next year on the first Saturday of the year. Each tree recycled through this program was exchanged for a free dogwood seedling. Some participants also collected Christmas tree mulch to use in their yard.
